This individual may be the team-coach, team-captain, or team-parent who will not only wear a tournament-issued wristband for the duration of the tournament BUT will be expected to be in attendance for each scheduled team game.

Why the wristband?

This helps our tournament staff, referees, and volunteers quickly identify the go-to person for each team —whether it's for check-in, updates, or in-game questions. It cuts down on confusion and helps us serve you faster and better!

By wearing this wristband, the Team Representative is stepping up as your team's point person. They are accepting the responsibility of representing your team—an important role that helps keep the event organized, safe, and fun for everyone. We need your help to keep things moving and make this tournament a great experience for all.

By virtue of the above signature, the **TEAM REPRESENTATIVE** agrees to be the contact for:

- Game time changes or updates
- Score or rule clarifications
- Emergency or first aid info
- Sportsmanship and sideline support
- Dispute Resolution

See 3 Slam Rules for Sportsmanship

- **1. Show respect for your opponents.** Remember the Golden Rule: Treat your opponent the way you would want them to treat you.
- 2. Show respect for the monitors. Tournament officials are trained and expected to be impartial guides and arbitrators of See 3 Slam games. Sportsmanship requires the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials. Remember, our tournament officials and volunteers are the foundation of this event; without them, there would be no See 3 Slam.
- 3. Know, understand, and appreciate the rules of See 3 Slam. A familiarity with the rules of See 3 Slam and the recognition of their necessity for a fair contest is essential. Good sportsmanship suggests the importance of conforming to the spirit as well as the letter of the rules. (Please note that See 3 Slam rules allow for technical fouls or disqualification for severe cases of unsportsmalike behavior.)
- **4. Keep your cool!** Sportsmanship requires discipline to maintain your perspective no matter what happens in a game, whether you're playing or watching.
- **5.** Cheer for your team and the other team! Applause for a good performance of an opponent is a demonstration of generosity and goodwill.

See 3 Slam requires that players and fans refrain from:

- 1. Yelling during the opponent's free-throw attempts, or anytime in a disrespectful manner, or to distract your opponents.
- 2. Booing, heckling or antagonizing a monitor, coach, or player.
- 3. Blaming the loss of a game on the monitors or coaches.
- 4. Using profanity or displaying anger that draws attention away from the game.

Technical, flagrant and intentional fouls against you, your teammates, or fans will result in the opposing team receiving one-point and possession of the ball.
